

DUFFIELD PARISH COUNCIL

BYELAWS made under Section 164 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and Sections 12 and 15 of the Open Spaces Act, 1906, by the Parish Council of Duffield with respect to pleasure grounds.

APPROVED by the Parish Council on the 13th day of December, 1977.

CONFIRMED by the Secretary of State, Home Office, on the 23rd day of February, 1978, to come into operation on that date.

DUFFIELD PARISH COUNCIL

As it is necessary to the proper preservation of land in the ground as an officer of the Council, or by any person or persons of any persons employed by the Council, shall not be deemed an offence against these byelaws.

BYELAWS

A person shall not in the ground

(a) without authority or negligently use or allow any wall or fence to be erected, prolonged, or any building, barrier, railing, post or sign of any description to be erected;

(b) erect any wall or fence in or across, the ground, or any part, in any building, railing, post or other erection;

for Eyes Meadow and The Gray Recreation Ground

(c) erect any wall or fence, or any part of any building or erection, or any structure provided for use in the laying out or improvement of the ground.

A person shall not attempt in pursuance of a lawful agreement with the Council, or otherwise, to use exercise of any lawful right or privilege being or about to be brought into the ground any part of building or fence or any railing, post, stile or sign.

A person shall not, except in the exercise of any lawful right or privilege being or about to be brought into the ground any building, fence, railing, post or sign.

(i) a building, fence, railing or other similar structure;

(ii) a building, fence, railing or other structure or structure provided for use in the laying out or improvement of a public or private open space.
